


NEWSLETTER 5- Friday 6th October 2023

PGL Residential – Miss Drissell, Mrs Mills, Mrs Moore, Mrs van Zyl and I, took 39 Year 6 Pupils to PGL Liddington in Swindon this week. They took part in a number of activities including raft building, abseiling, and archery in the daytime and had a campfire and sport night in the evenings. This was a great opportunity for pupils to develop their teamwork, problem solving and communication skills, overcome challenges and increase their confidence. Parents of children in Y5 have been sent details of next year's trip this week.



Key Stage 1 - Children in KS1 had a fantastic day learning more about the Great Fire of London. They took part in a variety of activities that included making a quill and writing in shorthand like Samuel Pepys and creating a piece of artwork where they had to use straws to blow different colours of paint to create fire. They also took part in a reenactment of putting out the fire, using water and a bucket. They had to work as a team to put the 'fire' out. The children also did some weaving and learnt how clothes were made in 1666. We concluded the day by sharing our learning with the rest of the school in a whole school assembly. Thank you to the parents for their huge effort to ensure the children all looked the part. There were some amazing costumes and we loved seeing the rats, bakers, maids, chimney sweeps and those who even came as fire!

<u>Lower Key Stage 2</u> – As part of their Stone Age topic LKS2 have been making Stone Age oatcakes, which were delicious. The children are now writing their own set of instructions to recreate the recipe.

<u>Warwickshire Sings</u> – Y4 have been taking part in a year group singing lesson. They are learning the song "Bungalow" and "Janie Mana" which they will be performing in the Summer Term.
