<u>Y3/4 Boys Football</u> - Our Y3/4 boys football team had a match against Claverdon this week. It was great team performance with a hat trick from one of our boys resulting in a 6-2 win for us. Well done boys and thank you parents for transport and support.

<u>Bishopswood Trip</u> - Children in year 3 & year 4 went on a trip to Bishopswood on Tuesday for their Stone Age to Iron Age topic. They hunted and gathered Stone Age animals and plants, made flour by grinding seed with stone, made fire with flint and made fish nets. They also built animal pens by weaving willow and Stone Age style homes and completed cave art activities. Thank you to all of our volunteers for helping on this trip.

<u>Superheroes Topic</u> - The Reception classes enjoyed a visit from our local firefighters. The Firefighters spoke to the children about the different jobs they do in the community and talked about the different parts of their uniform. The children had the opportunity to sit in the fire engine and look at the equipment that is used. They were also lucky enough to have a go at squirting water from the hose.

<u>Science Day</u> – Last week he hosted an Odgen Trust Science Day. Some year 3 children took part in a variety of activities - sorted light sources, reflective materials, wrote messages and reflected them in mirrors to then see if they could crack each others codes and manoeuvred round a maze by only looking up into a mirror. Then they also learnt about shadows and made shadow figures then finished off the afternoon making our very own kaledoscopes which children decorated. Children had a wonderful day and it was great to welcome other pupils from the other schools in the Ogden trust - Mappleborough Green, Mount Carmel, St Nicholas and Tardebigge.

On Monday 5 year 1 children went to an Ogden Trust Science Day at Mount Carmel Primary School with Mrs Jewell this week. The pupils learnt about forces and how they work. They were challenged to build the tallest and strongest spaghetti tower (Bidford were proud runners up), and make rocket mice to see who could shoot their mouse up the highest by using different sized empty bottles and differing amounts of force. There were mice whizzing all around the classroom and great fun was had by all the children (and adults!) who took part.

<u>Bikeability</u> – A number of our year 6 pupils took part in a cycling course this week developing their skills, knowledge and understanding how to cycle safely on the roads. The programme is part of a national scheme taught first on the school playground and then out on the roads by experienced cyclists. Pupils learn about starting and stopping journeys, passing stationary vehicles, understanding road signs and markings, how to negotiate junctions and how to share the road with others.
