<u>Open Classrooms</u> – We will be welcoming parents into school on Wednesday 6th December at 3:20pm for an open classroom session, which will be an opportunity to come and see your child's class and the work they have been producing this term. Parents with pupils in Miss Powell's class are invited on Thursday 7th December.

<u>UKS2</u> – Pupils are reading "Journey to Jo'burg" as part of their new English unit. They have been focusing on descriptive writing in English and have collected a range of vocabulary describing the shanty towns in South Africa, and have then used that vocabulary to write a description using figurative language and prepositional openers.

In Computing, their topic is quizzing and they have been using Purple Mash to create quizzes aimed at KS1 based on either fairytales or animals, we were very impressed with what they produced.

<u>Superhero Day</u> - The Reception children came to school dressed as all different kinds of superheroes on Tuesday. Pupils took part in a variety of activities including designing their very own super potatoes, looking after patients in a dolls' hospital, participating in superhero missions, making superhero vehicles using crates and tyres, designing superhero capes, mask and super power wrist band making. We all had a fantastic day. Thank you to all the parents for their support with providing outfits for the children.

<u>Christmas Activities</u> - It is lovely to have the Christmas vibe emerging around our school now that we are in December. Wonderful Christmas displays are appearing along our corridors and decorations are being created for our Christmas tree entry for the competition at St Lawrence Church next weekend. Children in Reception and KS1 have been rehearsing their productions and we are busy ordering 315 oranges ready to create our Christingles. Wednesday 20th December, and invite pupils to come to school wearing their Christmas jumpers and looking festive.

<u>Nut Allergies</u> - Several children and staff in school have severe nut allergies. Please help us ensure their safety by not including any nut products in packed lunches, this includes chocolate spread.

<u>After School Clubs</u> – If your child cannot attend their afterschool club please let the office know. We have had a few children not come along this week and we could not contact their parents to ensure they had returned home safely.

<u>Attendance</u> -Parents of registered pupils have a legal duty under the Education Act 1996 to make sure that children of compulsory school age attend school on a regular and full time basis. We believe that children can reach their full potential only by receiving full-time education, through regular and structured attendance. Bidford School expects all pupils to arrive and leave school punctually and to achieve at least 96% attendance. All staff are concerned for the children's welfare and happiness and everyone plays a part in promoting regular attendance and punctuality.
