<u>Reception</u> - The children have been looking at baby photographs and have been making observations as to how they are growing and changing. They have been naming parts of the body and used the story of Funny Bones to learn about our skeleton. They have also explored sequencing events in maths. They sequenced pictures to make a jam sandwich before actually making and eating one.

<u>KS1</u> - Key Stage 1 have loved writing their stories based on The Tunnel. They thought about how Jack got into the forest and what happened once he was there! We also loved our well-being day on Monday and particularly enjoyed the breakdancing!

LKS2 –LKS2 have been learning about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb. He was discovered by an archaeologist called Howard Carter who was one of the only ones to believe there were still tombs to discover in the Valley of the Kings. Tutankhamun was discovered with over 5,000 of his possessions! WOW! That is a lot to be buried with. In English, we have been writing a wanted poster for Sennapod. He was last seen leaving the History Museum in the middle of the night. Miss Drissell's class have been creating Egyptian artwork using a wide variety of artistic techniques. They have been using string and polystyrene printing to create background effects, used watercolour to paint a side profile of their chosen God and then they used repeated patterns using Egyptian hieroglyphs to create a border. The other LKS2 classes are looking forward to doing this next week.

<u>UKS2</u> – On Thursday, Year 5 and 6 welcomed Jake, from Compass Connect for Health, into their classrooms to work with the children on the subject of what makes a good night's sleep. This was arranged following the outcomes of the Year 6 health questionnaires earlier in the year, which revealed that the children wanted guidance on this subject. We looked at routines for the hours prior to sleep and how these can be arranged to give a good sleep quality. In addition, the children looked at bedroom environments that could give a good (or bad) quality of sleep. Finally, the children looked at the stages of sleep and the importance of a good night's sleep. The children have taken away their sleep diaries, which can be used to track their bedtime routines and their sleep qualities. We are sure that the children will benefit hugely from learning about this extremely important part of a healthy lifestyle.

Football Match - On Wednesday, our Y5/6 Boys Football team played Mappleborough Green School in a league match. Bidford were leading 5-3 until the final 10 minutes, unfortunately Bidford conceded two late goals resulting in a 5-5 draw. Thank you to parents for supporting us in the rain.

<u>iSingPOP Event</u> – Wow - what a day! It was so fantastic to see the children loving our iSingPOP sessions. The sessions engaged the children using dancing and singing to teach about Christian stories. The children learnt about Lent and Easter and danced their way through the sessions!

<u>Y5 and Y6 RSE Workshops</u> – a huge thank you to all of the parents that were able to make the RSE workshop, we hope you found it informative. The workshops will demonstrate how reading will be taught in your child's class so that you are able to support them at home and develop an understanding of the reading curriculum in the different Key Stages. These sessions will start at 9am and run for approximately 45minutes.
