**Reception** – went on a visit to Oversley Hill Farm and had a fantastic time. They learnt so much about the farm. They bottle fed the lambs and stroked the cows and calves. Most of the adults and children decided that Dotty was their favourite cow. They saw the scales that calves are weighed on and found out that the weight of three children is the same as a new born calf! All the children had the opportunity to sit in a tractor and they saw how a fresh loaf of bread was made and they even made some butter. The bread and butter was brought back to school for the children to taste.

**KS1** - have been learning all about the Easter story in RE and have been thinking about how Christians celebrate the festival. They have thought about festivals that other religions celebrate and how they compare with Easter. They also took part in All-Stars cricket taster sessions, in which they had loads of fun and it was great to see them joining in with such big smiles on their faces.

The Year 1 children had a visit from the local firefighters. The children learnt the safety phrases 'Stop, drop and roll' and 'Matches and lighters never touch, they can hurt you very much'. They enjoyed watching Mrs Horsburgh get dressed up as a fire fighter. They were encouraged to check the safety of their homes against the firefighter's checklist, ensuring they have working fire alarms and have a fire escape plan for their families.

LKS2 – As part of world book day, LKS2 looked at the story of Little Red Riding Hood from the wolf's

perspective and how the whole situation was a complete misunderstanding. While the wolf was being held in custody the children wrote emails to Judge Justice protesting the



wolf's innocence.

**<u>UKS2</u>** - have been doing art inspired by Edvard Munch 'The Scream'. They have created a background using oil pastel and combined mixed media with digital art to create their own version.
