<u>Reception –</u> have been learning about dinosaurs. We have introduced some new vocabulary such as herbivore, extinct, fossil and pre-historic. The children have loved exploring the different types of dinosaurs, drawing their own and using shapes and pasta to create some effective dinosaur pictures.

<u>KS1</u> - have been trying their hand at sewing! The children had to think about an African themed pattern and design their own. Following this, they learnt how to do a running stitch, which was a completely new skill for most children. They did an amazing job and produced some brilliant, colourful products. They should now be able to fix anything you want at home! Thank you to all of our volunteers who came in and supported the children.

<u>LKS2</u> - have been learning about the process of mummification. They enjoyed wrapping up their classmates in 'expensive linen'. They then went on to learn about the eight steps of mummification. A few gory details included pulling the brain out through the nostrils using a small metal hook and removing the internal organs and placing them into Canopic jars. Fun fact: many Egyptian women shaved their heads and wore wigs to prevent them from getting headlice!



<u>UKS2</u> – during wellbeing day, the children took part in three activities: card games - where they learnt to play 'Go Fish' and 'Cheat' they also learnt the meaning of phrases like, "Keep your cards close to your chest and have a card up your sleeve". As well as this, they learnt breakdancing where they were taught several moves by a Breakdancing World Champion who has performed in front of the Queen. Finally, the children played Tri-golf, this is a mini version of golf where children used two different types of clubs to hit the ball.

<u>Boys Football Match</u> – Our Y5/6 team played a match again St Mary's Studley on Wednesday. The game ended with a 6-2 defeat. The boys pushed ahead to get some more goals but unfortunately St Mary's were resilient in their defence. Thank you to parents for supporting the team.
