Dear Parents, Pupils & Governors,

<u>Ukraine</u> – This week in Collective Worship, we spent some time reflecting on the sad situation in Ukraine. Thinking about the importance of peace, hope and love, we gave thanks for our safety and thought about others who are not safe in the world. Our School Council are organising a collection of much needed items to be sent to the Ukrainian refugees – an email has been sent this week with more details.

Pancake Day

- In Collective Worship we also considered why we eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. A Christian festival celebrated in many countries, it falls on the Tuesday before the beginning of Lent. During Lent, Christians give up luxuries to remember when Jesus went into the desert for 40 days to fast and pray, so we make pancakes to use up the supplies in our cupboards.
- Following its absence last year, the commotion and excitement returned to our school during the annual Staff Pancake Race! For the first time ever, I won, with Mr Thackway second and Mrs Satchwell third. It was reported that Mr Thackway was the only member of staff not to drop his pancake, however I dispute this, as I know I didn't drop mine either it just goes to show age does not impair agility! Miss Drissell was leading the race all of the way but was over confident within metres of the finish line, she flipped her pancake for a final time and it was grabbed by the wind causing her to finish unplaced.
- Delicious aromas have been wafting around the Reception and KS1 corridor as children helped to mix and make their own pancakes.

<u>World Book Day</u> – On Thursday we dressed as our favourite book characters and celebrated World Day Book Day with a range of book related activities all around the school. All children enjoyed sharing stories and the activities included rewriting stories to retell books children had been reading, designing bookmarks & book covers and writing persuasive letters to Ladybird publishers to ask them to publish the story of Little Red Riding Hood from the wolf's point of view!

<u>Reception Topic</u> – Children in Reception have been learning about Polar Bears and Penguins this week. They did a blubber investigation to help them understand why the animals do not feel the cold, including making their own blubber mitts from lard. Children also looked at the globe to find out where they live.
