Poetry – Children in Years 3 & 4 have been reading the poem called 'Cats Sleep Anywhere' by Eleanor Farjeon. They identified poetic features and then drew a series of pictures to help them remember the poem. Some brave members of the class stood up at the front of the class and used their pictures to recite the poem from memory. The children will be using this technique to learn another poem.

<u>Christmas Activities</u> - It is lovely to have the Christmas vibe emerging around our school now that we are in December. Wonderful Christmas displays are appearing along our corridors and decorations are being created for our Christmas Tree entry for the competition at St Lawrence Church next weekend. Children in Reception and KS1 have been rehearsing their productions and we are busy ordering 315 oranges ready to create our Christingles.

<u>Christmas Post Box</u> - The school Christmas postbox will be taking deliveries of Christmas cards from Mon 5th Dec. Please ensure all cards are addressed correctly with the <u>child's full name</u> and <u>class</u> on the envelope and send into school with your child.

<u>School Crossing Patrol</u> – Our school crossing patrol, Mrs Hunt is retiring at the end of term and her employer, Warwickshire County Council, have decided that following an assessment, a manned crossing is no longer required. The County Council can only fund School Crossing Patrols at sites that meet the criteria in the national guidelines produced by Road Safety GB. This criteria depends principally on the number of primary school age children and the number of vehicles crossing at the site at the relevant times. When the assessment was completed, this calculation was 70% below the required threshold. We have always included road safety in our school curriculum and we will be providing the children with additional road safety and crossing advice during the week leading up to the Christmas break and on their return in January.

<u>Chat, Coffee and Croissants</u> - Please come in to the hall at 9am on **Mon 5th Dec** to enjoy a cup of coffee/tea and a croissant whilst having an opportunity to chat about mental health. The Educational Mental Health Practitioners will be coming along to introduce themselves to you and will be available to discuss any questions or concerns you have about your child's mental health, this could be around sleep routine, low mood, anxiety or anything else you would like to know more about or seek support from the experts.

Year 2 PE – Children in Mr Plumbe's class will not be having PE on Weds 7th Dec. Please send them into school in their uniform.

<u>Year 1/2 Forest School</u> – Children in Mrs Flavell's class will not be having forest school on Thurs 8th Dec. Please send them into school in their uniform.

<u>After School Clubs</u> – If your child cannot attend their afterschool club please let the office know. We have had a few children not come along this week and we could not contact their parents to ensure they had returned home safely.

<u>Celebration Collective Worship</u> – There will no Celebration Collective Worship for the rest of this term. The next one will be on Friday January 6th.
