<u>Reception</u> – have had an exciting week making, cooking and decorating gingerbread men before finally getting to eat them. The children all worked hard weighing out the ingredients, mixing and rolling the dough. They have also sequenced some pictures of how they made the gingerbread men and have written some instructions to help Mrs Roberts make gingerbread men at home.



<u>KS1</u> – have been joining in the hype of Euro 2024, by finding out about the history of the Euros, countries involved and creating their own fact files full of all the knowledge they have learnt. They have had fun discussing who they think might win and the scores from each match that has taken place so far.

LKS2 – visited Oversley Farm to participate in a river study. They have continued to build on their knowledge of the water cycle, been introduced to the stages of a river, investigated the river flow and been on a mini-

beast hunt. Miss Eaves' class have started exploring their art focus of 'landscapes' by using the grid technique to enlarge a nature landscape, the other LKS2 are looking forward to doing this as well.



<u>UKS2</u> – have been learning how to write an argument, looking at opinions and reasons to strengthen their case. They were given the heading "The internet should be banned for children under the age 11" which made very interesting reading.
