<u>Reception</u> - We have enjoyed welcoming our new children into class this week and we feel we are going to have an amazing year of excitement and discovery. At the start of each year we always complete some informal assessments (as required by the government) of the children, to ensure we can best build on their prior knowledge. <u>Classroom Visits</u> – Parents are invited to visit their child's classroom and meet their teacher after school on Tuesday 10th September. We will dismiss all children as normal at home time and once all children have left the classrooms you will be welcomed back inside with your children for them to show you their work space. Please be mindful this is not a parents' evening but teachers will be available to answer any questions you may have.

<u>Contact Details & Consent (GDPR)</u> –Data Collection sheets have been sent out this week. Please check the details carefully and amend as required. It is important that we have up to date contact information and safeguarding regulations require us to have at least <u>two</u> emergency contacts. Please remember to sign the form

on the back page. All signed forms should be returned by <u>Monday 16th September</u>. Our Privacy Notice detailing how we use information about children is on our school website.

<u>Celebration Collective Worship</u> - Celebration Collective Worship for children in Years 1 to 6 will restart on Friday 13th Sept at 2.45pm. If your child has achieved an award outside of school for their attainment in a specific activity (e.g. swimming, music, gymnastics) they are able to bring it in and have it presented in front of the whole school. We do not accept certificates for attendance at theme parks, holiday or sports clubs. Please bring in certificates/trophies before the end of Thursday.

School Meals – The price of a school meal is £2.75 for children in KS2 and are free for children in Reception & KS1. Families of children entitled to income dependent free school meals should still register so that we can claim Pupil Premium of up to £1385 to help support your child in school. Please go to www.warwickshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals to apply or contact us in confidence for further information. Deli bags are available for children in Reception and KS1. School meals are ordered at registration each morning so please ensure your child is familiar with the menu choice before coming into school. Menus can be found on the school website.

<u>Nut Allergies</u> - Several children and staff in school have severe nut allergies. Please help us ensure their safety by not including any nut products in packed lunches.

<u>Parking</u> – There is no parent parking on the school site during drop off and pick up times. Please use the car park in Wards Lane, behind the Fire Station.

<u>Milk</u> – If you would like your child to receive milk during the school day, please apply online at <u>www.coolmilk.com</u>. Children who are **under 5** receive free milk, but parents still need to apply online. Children who qualify for welfare free school meals are also entitled to free milk – please ask at the office.

<u>Clubs</u> – Emails have been sent this week with details of after school clubs starting next week and a link to register online:

<u>Bellboating</u> – The Year 5 and 6 children will be going bellboating w/c 16th September and should come to school wearing plenty of layers – t-shirt/sweatshirt/fleece/joggers/tracksuit (not jeans) with a rain jacket (and waterproof trousers if they have some). Children will need to bring a packed lunch and should also bring spare clothes in a carrier bag. Mrs Satchwell's class – Monday 16th, Miss Waters' Class Tuesday 19th & Miss Drissell's class Thursday 19th.

<u>Year 4 Swimming</u> – Sessions begin on Wednesday 11th September. Pupils in Year 4 should come to school in their PE kit with their swimming kit in a named bag. They do not need to bring in their book bag on a Wednesday. Pupils need to arrive promptly at 8.45am and come to the school hall as normal. Please ensure your child has been to the toilet before arriving at school. The coach will be leaving at 8.55am and unfortunately any later arrivals will not be able to go swimming. Payment can be made online.

<u>Year 6 PGL</u> – The PGL parent meeting will be held in school on Tuesday 11th September at 6.00pm. Parents and Year 6 children are invited to attend.

<u>Uniform</u> – It has been wonderful to see all of the children return to school looking so smart in their school uniform. Unfortunately, we have already had a couple of missing items - please ensure all items are labelled so we can easily reunite items with the correct child. All children also need to bring in a <u>raincoat</u> every day for playtimes, as we all know how unpredictable British weather can be! On PE days, please send your child in to

school wearing their PE kits (except Reception pupils) and also on forest school days, pupils need to come in to school wearing their forest school clothes, with their wellies and waterproofs in a named carrier bag.

<u>Book Bags</u> – Children in EYFS & KS1 should use book bags for transporting books to and from school - please do not use a rucksack. Book bags can be purchased from the school office.

<u>Reading Books</u> – Home reading books will begin to be issued over the next few weeks in line with our homework policy. Reading with your child can have astonishing benefits from comfort and reassurance, confidence and security, relaxation, happiness and fun. It can also build self-esteem, develops their vocabulary, feeds their imagination and can even improve their sleeping patterns. Please also check at home for any school reading books that you may still have from last year.

Leave of Absence

The Government issued new regulations in September 2013 regarding Leave of Absence; The Education (Pupil Regulations) (England) Regulations 2006 as amended by Education (Pupil Regulations) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013

- ➤ Head teachers **shall not** grant **any** Leave of Absence during term time **unless they consider** there are **exceptional** circumstances relating to the application.
- > Parents do not have any entitlement to take their children on holiday during term time. Any application for leave must establish that there are **exceptional circumstances** and the Head Teacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave.
 - > Head Teachers will determine how many school days a child may be absent from school if the leave is granted.
- > The school can only consider applications for Leave of Absence which are made by the resident parent. i.e the parent with whom the child normally resides.
- > Applications for Leave of Absence must be made in advance and failure to do so will result in the absence being recorded as "unauthorised". This may result in legal action against the parent, by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.
- > Applications for Leave of Absence which are made in advance and refused will result in the absence being recorded as "unauthorised". This may result in legal action against the parent, by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice, if the child is absent from school during that period.
- > All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service of Warwickshire County Council.
- The Warwickshire Attendance Service have the authority to consider issuing Fixed Penalty Notices for Leave of Absence in line with the Warwickshire County Council's Non-School Attendance and Penalty Notices Code of Conduct. (A copy of which can be found at https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/pupilnonattendance).
- ➤ If a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued and is not paid within the timeframe set out in that Notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal prosecution proceedings under S444 of Education Act 1996.

Each application for a Leave of Absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.
