<u>Reception -</u> have been comparing similarities and differences between themselves. They have been observing features of their faces in a mirror and made some observational drawings of themselves. They have been sharing rhyming stories and identifying rhyming words. In maths they have been exploring different ways of sorting items.

Reception PE - We want to praise the children in Reception for their efforts in being independent when changing for PE sessions. We ask if parents could help encourage the children in putting on their own socks when getting dressed at home.

KS1 (Y1,Y1/2 & Y2) – have been busy starting our reading VIPER activities focusing on all of the skills we will need to become confident and complete readers. We have all read the text 'Staying Healthy' which has helped us learn what we need to stay healthy. In addition, the teachers have enjoyed hearing about the children's family tree projects that are due on the 3<sup>rd</sup> October. Within our topic work we have been comparing schools from the past and have valuable opportunities to play games which children would have played at school in the Victorian times.

<u>LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4)</u> – have been working on so many fun learning opportunities. In History, they have learnt about the Roman army. They learnt about who could be in the army, their training regime and what their armour looked like. In Science, they have been learning about different types of skeleton. Ask them what a hydrostatic skeleton is - you'll be amazed! Year 4 have also been learning more French, ask them to count to 10!

<u>UKS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6)</u> - have been rounding numbers to the nearest million and we have also been learning to read and write roman numerals to 1000! The children have also enjoyed problem solving involving roman numerals.

#### **PGL**


