Reception – have been learning about planet Earth. We have enjoyed reading 'Lottie's Letters' and 'The Clean up Spree'. These stories led us onto sharing ideas about ways in which we can look after our world. We have explored using paints, foam and paper mache to create pictures and models of planet Earth. We have enjoyed looking at maps and talking about countries and features in the world. In maths we have been investigating mass focussing on the vocabulary heavy/light/heavier/lighter/heaviest/lightest.



KS1 (Y1,Y1/2 & Y2) – have been learning about multiplication in Year 2 and revising place value in Year 1. There have been some super stars across the key stage, making equal groups and finding one more or less than twenty. We have been continuing our learning by reading 'Lost and Found'. The children have explored verbs and conjunctions within this topic. Lastly, children have identified physical features of Antarctica, like glaciers and sea-ice, and watched some real icebergs being formed, which was extremely exciting.



<u>LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4)</u> – have had a wonderful week. In English, we continued our work on 'How to train your dragon' by Cressida Cowell and started to focus on *The Gronckle - a* plug ugly dragon that can be a snot green or pooey brown colour! The children collected adjectives to help them to write a character description. In History, we have been learning about Anglo Saxon village life and learnt amongst other things, that Anglo Saxons were first and foremost farmers.

KS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6) – have completed a Science experiment in groups to investigate the bounciness of a range of different balls. We found out the 'rubber' bouncy ball bounced the highest, due to them being made from rubber. However, ping pong balls bounced the most amount of times before coming to a stop due to its light weight, thin, plastic. We have also been looking at precautions for the war and the use of the Black out. Following this, have made posters reminding people what to do during the blackout.
