<u>Reception</u> – have been learning more about the planets in the solar system. They have been learning about day and night and sequencing activities in their day. They have enjoyed creating some planet pictures using tissue paper, paints and chalks – all of which look fantastic.

<u>KS1 (Y1, Y1/2 & Y2)</u> – have been learning about materials in science. They have explored what different materials are made from and what different objects can be made from. In Year 2, they are learning about multiplication by sharing and grouping, along with beginning to learn their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. They have learnt about the different climates in geography and revisited the song about the oceans and continents, which the children can't get out of their heads! Next week the children will look forward to starting our 'Who is Jesus?' R.E. unit and exploring some other religious ideas.

<u>LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4)</u> – have been working hard this week. In English, they created their own dragons, thinking about their appearance and special powers. Next week, they will be creating a Top Trumps card about their dragons. In Science, they have been testing the strength of magnets, ask them how they did this! It has been another busy week and we have been massively impressed with them as always!


<u>KS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6</u>) - have been exploring reversible and irreversible changes through a series of scientific experiments. In the experiments, the children used heat to transform bread to toast, snapped glowsticks to produce light, and even mixed bicarbonate of soda with vinegar and with citric acid solution to create different chemical reactions. The children had a lot of fun working scientifically as they explored how materials change and the highlight of it all for the children, was watching Miss Waters get covered in vinegar!



Athletics Competition

Some of our Year 5 & 6 children went to an athletics competition at Alcester Grammar School today, competing against eight others schools. All the children had a very enjoyable morning and did an amazing job in the field and track events. We are very proud of the children for coming 4th overall, well done!
