Reception – children dressed up and enjoyed a day of space activities. Pupils made clay aliens, created iced planet themed biscuits and enjoyed using crates and tyres to build rockets and moon buggies to use for their role play. Space adventures were continued indoors in a space station. The children also had the opportunity to make space ships for their clay aliens and investigated how to launch mini paper rockets. A group of children went to the Co-op at the start of the week to buy items needed for our planet themed biscuit activity. The children have enjoyed sharing their knowledge about what they have learnt throughout our space theme. <u>KS1 (Y1, Y1/2 & Y2)</u> – have focused on internet safety and been working really hard to understand our SMART rules for being safe online. In addition, the children have been learning about who Jesus was. They explored this topic through a Christian worldview and also linked this to other moments that make Jesus who he was. For example, the children really enjoyed learning about 'Salvation' and the Easter story as we approach this important time in our calendar. 


LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4) – have had a brilliant week and have worked so hard, the children have been exploring Viking longships and why they were such a successful form of transport. It took the Vikings over 60 days of 24/7 sailing to reach Newfoundland in USA from Norway the equivalent distance of 18,000 laps around the school field! In Maths, our focus has been division, specifically short division! They learnt lots this week about the importance of being aware of phishing when using the Internet. They also learnt about how to spot a scam - ask your child about it! Thank you to all our parents for helping us this half term.

KS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6) – our Year 5 children had a fantastic visit from local firefighters, who taught them all about fire safety! The firefighters shared important tips on how to keep themselves and their families safe, including the best precautions to take in case of a fire. The children learned the importance of having a fire escape plan, what to do in an emergency and why checking smoke alarms regularly at home is so important. A huge thank you to Alcester Fire Service for an engaging and informative session.


