<u>Reception</u> – The highlight of the week for the Reception children was a visit to Oversley Hill Farm where they learnt so much about the farm and animals. They had the opportunity to feed the chickens, pat the cows and stroke the sheep. All the children sat in the big farm tractor. They saw calves and lambs and eggs that the hens had laid. They made butter and tasted it on freshly baked bread. Everyone had a fantastic time including the coach journey.







<u>KS1 (Y1, Y1/2 & Y2)</u> – Well, what a lovely week it has been! From pancake making on Monday, to topic day on Tuesday and then finishing off with World Book Day on Thursday.

KS1 have really enjoyed dressing up as polar explores this week for our Frozen Planet Topic day! They took part in many activities like seeing what melts ice the fastest (sugar, salt or hot water), writing an information page about Antarctica and making clay penguins. Not only have we taken part in these exciting activates, we also dressed up for world book day - the children excelled in making artwork based on Emily Gravett's - Wolves as well as reading with children from KS2 and even writing about wolves with information from the book.





LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4) – have had a lovely week and have thoroughly enjoyed the sun making an appearance! In English, we have been planning and creating our own adverts for Thor'sday Thursday. We thought about persuasive features such as rhetorical questions, hyperbole and alliteration. In History, we started to present our knowledge about our topic. This allowed the children to show us how much we have learnt about the Vikings whilst presenting it in a creative way. World book day was so much fun! Our activities were inspired by the book 'The incredible book eating boy' by Oliver Jeffers. We created our own incredible character and a comic story to go along with it. They thought about what their favourite book would taste like and wrote about their own expert subjects that they could teach our teachers!

KS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6) — have been exploring 'I don't Like Reading. Never. Ever. The End' and using it as inspiration to create their own fantastic versions! From stories about not liking football or Lego to tales of avoiding music and cutlery, it has been wonderful to see the children write their own creative and humorous story!


Note/Reminders
