From 18th–20th November, our Year 3 and 4 pupils will battle schools nationwide in a TTR competition! To kick it off, children can **dress as rockstars on Tuesday 18th**. Plus, on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> November we will be hosting a in school LKS2 vs UKS2 battle (no dressing up)— who will win the ultimate times table battle? Let's rock those times tables!

#### Reception

We are incredibly proud of how well the Reception children have settled into school life. They have enjoyed exploring their new learning environment and have been busy making new friends and learning new routines. We have also spent time talking about our families and sharing ideas about what makes a good friend. Stories such as *The Rainbow Fish*, *Sharing a Shell*, and *The Selfish Crocodile* have supported this learning. We have been exploring the theme of autumn, which included a walk around our school grounds, creating autumn tree pictures, and collecting lots of colourful leaves. As part of our harvest celebrations, we shared the story of *The Little Red Hen* and loved making our own bread rolls to eat. During the final week of the half term, we learned about Diwali, the Hindu festival of light. The children made clay diyas, created rangoli patterns, and took part in some Diwali dancing. The children have made an excellent start with our phonics programme, which will support them in developing their reading and writing skills.

After half term, we are looking forward to learning about people who help us in our local community and the important roles they play, such as police officers, firefighters, doctors, postal workers, and many more.

#### KS1

The team all agree that it has been a fantastic term, and the children have settled brilliantly into their new classes. It's wonderful to see them arriving each day with smiles and a real enthusiasm for learning. It was also a pleasure to meet so many of you at our consultations this week.

Our topic work has brought our learning together beautifully, and we have loved finding out about *The Great Fire of London*. In guided reading, we explored fascinating facts and a variety of text types, while our English lessons followed Boxton and Vlad as they escaped from Pudding Lane—helping us understand the human impact of the fire. In history, we used timelines to follow events and investigated how sources can help us learn about the past.\_Our 'WOW' days have been real highlights, with the children producing stunning artwork for our corridor displays and throwing themselves into each activity with great enthusiasm.\_In maths, we have focused on sorting, place value, and addition and subtraction. The children have worked incredibly hard to master these key skills, and it was lovely to share their progress with parents.

Other highlights include improving our basketball skills in P.E. and learning about animals in science—plus one teacher's excitement over a rare moth spotted in his garden! We are only at the start of our learning journey this year, with plenty more to explore and enjoy next term. We wish everyone a restful and happy half-term break.





#### LKS2

Since September, Year 3 and 4 have had a busy and exciting start to the school year!

We began the term by writing instructions inspired by the book *How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth*. The children found this story very amusing and loved creating their own versions about washing an animal of their choice. During this unit, they focused on using imperative verbs and enjoyed practising how to be 'bossy' in their writing! More recently, we have moved on to *Stone Age Boy*, where the children have been writing setting descriptions of a Stone Age camp, using expanded noun phrases and prepositional phrases to bring their writing to life. Mrs Foster even typed Fox Class's descriptions into AI to see what images were generated — the children were fascinated by the results! Mathematical thinking has been another key focus, with lots of place value recap and plenty of challenge in addition and subtraction. Some pupils have even taken their first steps into exchanging.

Turning back the clock, our History topic has taken us deep into the Stone Age. The children have explored tools, weapons, and homes across different periods, even designing and building their own models inspired by archaeological discoveries. To add extra excitement, Badger Class had the opportunity to interview a Neolithic farmer (via Al!) to uncover what life was really like during that time.

When it comes to Science, the children have been classifying vertebrates, searching for invertebrates in Forest School, and experimenting with classification keys — starting with sweets before moving on to animals of their choice. They also explored how issues such as flooding, deforestation, pollution, and new building developments can affect living things and their habitats.


Building on their reflective thinking, the children have been tackling the big RE question: "How might your worldview lead you to do hard things for good reasons?" This has led to thoughtful discussions about personal challenges, sacrifices, and how religious beliefs — such as fasting in Islam — link to doing difficult things for meaningful reasons.

Meanwhile, during Computing, Fox Class have been improving their typing speed with a touch of friendly competition against Mrs Foster, who's set some impressive scores to beat! Over in Badger and Hare Classes, pupils have been programming Micro: bits to display fun animations using LED lights.

Altogether, it's been a term filled with creativity, curiosity, and hands-on learning — and we can't wait to see what adventures await us next! Don't forget our Stone Age Topic Day on Thursday 4th December — more

information will be sent out after half term.









#### UKS2

This half term, Year 5/6 have been incredibly busy with a wide range of exciting learning experiences! In English, we explored *Tuesday* by David Wiesner, using it as inspiration for our journalistic writing — creating detailed news reports, eyewitness accounts, and even including direct speech to bring our stories to life. In Maths, we focused on number work, mastering addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. In Science, we explored electricity, investigating how to build and test electrical circuits. In Art, children developed their digital photography skills, creating collages from magazines and editing still images on iPads in the style of famous photographers, before designing their own album covers. During our Benin Art Day, pupils produced stunning animal sunset paintings and designed and made traditional African Mancala games. Our Year 6 children are still buzzing from their amazing trip to PGL, where they developed fantastic teamwork skills and made memories that will last a lifetime. To finish the half term, some of our children proudly represented Bidford at the Bellboating Regatta in Stratford-upon-Avon — they all had a fantastic time, did brilliantly, and represented our school exceptionally well!
