- A number hunt, the adult writes the numbers somewhere for the chid to go and ٠ find. This could be outside on a fence with chalk or on sticky notes around the house.

- You could get the children to identify numbers as you go on a walk, using doors numbers, numbers off a registration plate of a car etc.
