Read the words by sight. Extend to spelling the words and using them in sentences either verbally or written.

Write the words on paper squares and play a game of snap. Write the letters on paper squares and piece them together to make the words. Think of some words that rhyme with all.

# Phonics

#### ee, iah, oa

Ask a grown up to write words with these sounds in. (seem, deep, feet, seed, feed, light, fight, flight, sight, sigh, high, boat, soap, float, coat, toad, road). Read the words and group them together. For example group all the words with ee in. https://www.readwithphonics.com/



Below are some fun ways of doing this:

- Practise recognising numbers to 10, 20 and beyond.
- Write numbers on paper squares and place face down or in a bag/box. Take a number and count out corresponding number of objects. Use lego, pasta shells, toy cars, raisins etc.
- Count collections of objects for example a line of cars, beads on a string, stickers on a picture, raisins in a box. Find the matching number.
