## **Reception Maths Home Learning - Time**

Hunt around your home and see how many clocks you can find. Can you find any other ways of measuring time in your home? Find pictures of clocks, watches in magazines. Think about why there is a clock in that part of your house.



Ask your family to play What's the Time Mr Wolf? One person stands with their back to the group and everyone else asks "what's the time Mr. Wolf?" Mr. Wolf says a time e.g. 4 o'clock and everyone steps forward 4 steps. Continue with different times until Mr. Wolf says dinnertime! He chases everyone back to the start.



Look at the numbers on a clock and their position. Practise telling the time. Start with o'clock times first before moving onto half past times if your child is ready to.
