Science

Forces

In this unit, children will look at different look at a range of different forces: gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction. Develop an understanding of balanced and unbalanced forces and their effects. Investigate how mechanisms, like levers, pulleys and gears, help us to use smaller forces.

Light

In this unit, children learn that mirrors and shiny surfaces alter the direction in which light travels and that when they see objects, light enters the eye. Children contrast reflection and shadow formation.

In this unit, children will learn about the Kingdom of Benin - how the kingdom was established, their beliefs and creation stories, who rules over the kingdom and how it was governed as well as looking at both sides of the argument surrounding the Benin Bronzes.
